

1. PALANTIR'S COMPLICITY IN HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS

Palantir sells militarized AI, surveillance technologies, discriminatory policing systems to Israel and US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), among others. Palantir specifically sells technologies that are customized for Israel's regime of occupation, apartheid and genocide against Palestinians, and it then exports it globally as "field-tested" to enable human rights violations worldwide.

Palantir's human rights violations have been recognized by the United Nations Human Rights Council, Amnesty International, and as a result, the Catholic Sisters of St. Joseph of Peace [filed](#) a shareholder resolution for a human rights impact assessment that has been dismissed by the company.

- Palantir pioneered the use of AI for military purposes as a digital weapons manufacturer to transform corporate supply chain optimization into militarized ["kill chain"](#) optimization.
- Shortly after Israel began its genocide against 2.3 million Palestinians in Gaza in 2023, Palantir [entered into](#) a "strategic partnership" with Israel's Ministry of Defense to help the "war effort." The company [reported](#) "seeing high demand from Israel for new tools" and has been [providing](#) the Israeli military and intelligence agencies.
- Palantir's "ImmigrationOS" and "FALCON" technologies have been widely used by ICE. [Amnesty International](#) and the [Electronic Frontier Foundation](#) have criticized these systems, stating they facilitate workplace raids, track asylum-seekers, and monitor student activists without adequate human rights due diligence.
- Palantir is one of [ICE's biggest contractors](#). Between 2011 and June 2026, ICE [awarded](#) Palantir contracts worth a combined \$435 million. ICE has [used](#) Palantir's tools to conduct [workplace raids](#), [deportations](#), and [family separations](#).
- Since at least [2013](#), Palantir has given the notorious Israeli military intelligence Unit 8200 an ["enormous amount of assistance."](#) Despite Israel's well documented crimes in Gaza, Palantir continues to supply the Israeli military with data and AI services, in violation of its own [code of conduct](#), which says that the company "will not build products that exploit or disenfranchise disadvantaged and/or disempowered populations and/or undermine the rights and livelihoods of workers."
- Since September 2015, Palantir has provided the Israeli government with "predictive systems," which analyze civilian social media posts to identify Palestinians deemed a "threat." Palestinians are arbitrarily arrested and face long prison sentences for posting photos of family members imprisoned or killed by Israeli forces as a result of Palantir's racial-profiling systems.

2. PALANTIR'S EXPLICIT VIOLATIONS OF INTERNATIONAL LAW

Palantir's technology has knowingly and persistently enabled egregious violations of international law world-wide, therefore failing its legal obligations under international law.

- Even in light of the International Court of Justice's legally-binding [rulings](#) in 2024 to prevent Israel's plausible genocide in Gaza, as well as its [July 19 2024 Advisory Opinion](#) affirming Israel's illegal occupation and apartheid system, Palantir failed its [legal obligation](#) to avoid complicity in genocide, war crimes and crimes against humanity, and may also be accused of [incitement](#) to these crimes as well
- In 2025, the United Nations Human Rights Council posted UN Special Rapporteur Francesca Albanese's report, ["From Economy of Occupation to Economy of Genocide"](#), which identifies Palantir among the companies most complicit in Israel's international crimes against Palestinians.
- CEO Alex Karp publicly has [admitted](#) that his company is involved in killing Palestinians – "mostly terrorists," as he put it. [According to his biography](#), Palantir "software was used by the Israeli military in several raids in Gaza."
- The spyware and AI weapons company has openly [admitted](#) its tech is used to kill people.
- Palantir's Maven Smart System, an AI-driven targeting platform, was [used](#) by the US military on February 28, 2026, to bomb the Shajareh Tayyebbeh Elementary School in Minab, Iran, which killed 156 civilians, including 120 school girls.
- Palantir software [enabled](#) Israel's 2024 pager attacks in Lebanon, where thousands of pagers were detonated across Lebanon, killing and maiming many civilians. The attacks were [condemned](#) by United Nations experts as a "terrifying violation of international law."
- In January 2026 Pentagon staff [used](#) Palantir's software to bomb targets during the abduction of the Venezuelan President in January 2026, which caused the [deaths](#) of at least two civilians according to international monitors. 19 UN experts [condemned](#) the attack as an unprovoked use of armed force on a sovereign territory – a clear violation of the UN Charter.

3. PALANTIR LEADERSHIP'S IDEOLOGICAL COMMITMENT TO US DOMINATION

Palantir and its CEO Alex Karp published a deranged, ["technofascist" 22-point manifesto](#) that some policymakers in the West are calling the ["ramblings of a supervillain"](#) due to its overtly violent and imperialist ideological and material commitments to US imperialist domination and war. In 2025, Palantir [defined](#) its war-driven mission: "We built Palantir to ensure America's future, not to tinker at the margins. On the factory floor, in the operating room, across the battlefield—we build to dominate."

- Palantir is committed to building unregulated AI weapons and dual-use software with no ethical constraints, [asserting](#) in Karp's manifesto that technology belongs only to the US and the West, and should be weaponized to preserve their hegemony at all costs: "Silicon Valley owes a moral debt to the country that made its rise possible. The engineering elite of Silicon Valley has an affirmative obligation to participate in the defense of the nation...If a U.S. Marine asks for a better rifle, we should build it; and the same goes for software."
- Palantir is committed to Karp's deeply racist and colonial [assertion](#) that, "Some cultures have produced vital advances; others remain dysfunctional and regressive. All cultures are now equal. Criticism and value judgments are forbidden. Yet this new dogma glosses over the fact that certain cultures and indeed subcultures . . . have produced wonders. Others have proven middling, and worse, regressive and harmful."
- Palantir co-founder Peter Thiel [hosted](#) lectures about the antichrist at the Vatican's doorstep, arguing that the antichrist is not necessarily a person but could come as a global government system that would take control by exploiting people's fears around artificial intelligence, climate change or nuclear war. This is meant to directly undermine [AI experts](#) and the Church's [warnings](#) about unregulated AI.

4. HEALTHCARE WORKERS' OPPOSITION TO PALANTIR IN HOSPITALS

Healthcare workers and hospitals cannot honor their ethical obligation to "do no harm" while partnering with Palantir as the company directly enables the [bombing of Palestinian hospitals](#) in Gaza and the [murder](#) of nurses by ICE in the US. Additional concerns have been raised about the exposure of private patient information to Palantir and Palantir software's role in dangerously understaffing hospitals at the cost of patient lives.

- In 2026 National Nurses United (NNU), the largest nurses union in the US, also representing over 25,000 nurses at Catholic hospitals, [demanded](#) hospitals to [cut ties](#) and end all contracts with Palantir.
- In 2023, National Health Service England awarded a £330 million contract to Palantir to provide a new data platform. Since then, a broad, intersectional [coalition](#) of over 56 civil society organizations, including [Amnesty International](#) has demanded an end to the partnership.
- On 3 June 2026, the UK cross-party House of Commons Science, Innovation and Technology Committee called for the government to terminate NHS England's contract with Palantir because the company supports "highly controversial policies and activities," with Amnesty [arguing](#) that "a company profiting from such grave human rights abuses should have no role in our health system or wider public sector. Amnesty's message is clear - No Palantir in our NHS."

- The British Medical Association [opposes](#) Palantir's partnership with the National Health Service on the grounds of the company's human rights violations, role enabling violations of international law, and patient data security and calls on the UK government to enact the breakclause in 2027 to cut ties with Palantir.

5. INSTITUTIONS WORLDWIDE ARE ACTIVELY CUTTING TIES WITH PALANTIR OVER MASSIVE HUMAN RIGHTS CONCERNS THAT ESCALATE FIDUCIARY RISK

- On July 2nd, 2026, The Spanish government [instructed](#) state-backed companies to avoid signing new contracts with the US data analytics company Palantir and the country's sovereign wealth fund and state-owned industrial holding company have been instructed to blacklist the firm because of concerns that sensitive national security information could be exposed.
- On June 30th, 2026 the 227th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) unanimously [committed](#) to divest from Palantir Technologies. The denomination is the first large US institution to successfully target the company for divestment.
- On May 22nd, 2026 following pressure from human rights advocates and the UK Palestine Solidarity Campaign, London Mayor Sadiq Khan [blocked](#) a £50 million (\$66.4 million) contract between the Metropolitan Police and Palantir, saying it represented a "clear and serious breach" of procurement rules.
- In March 2026, following [Don't Buy Into Occupation](#) pressure, major Belgian bank Argenta completely [divested](#) from Palantir, and KBC and Degroof Petercam partially divested.
- In March 2026 New York City public hospitals [committed](#) not to renew a multimillion dollar Palantir contract after activists had raised concerns over Palantir's complicity in Israel's genocide of Palestinians and ICE violence.
- Over 40,000 UK National Health Service patients [filed](#) official complaints to their local hospitals about the use of Palantir AI in the NHS. Some hospitals have refused to use the technology publicly or privately. The Doctors' union has committed to opposing the roll out of Palantir tech in the NHS.
- In 2025, [Purge Palantir](#), a US intersectional collective of social justice organizations, called for institutions and government representatives to cut ties with Palantir due to its complicity in human rights violations globally, including in Israel's genocide in Gaza.
- In early 2026, National Nurses United (NNU), a US union with more than 225,000 members nationwide and the largest union and professional association of registered nurses in U.S. history, launched a [campaign](#) to end all Hospital Corporation of America (HCA) hospital contracts with Palantir.

- In August 2024, [San Francisco State University \(US\) divested from Palantir](#), selling its stock in the company after determining that it did not meet the university's human rights standards, as part of a \$163 million total investment portfolio realignment.
- In October 2024, one of the Nordic region's largest investors, [Storebrand Asset Management, sold its holdings worth \\$24 million](#) in Palantir due to concerns that the U.S. data firm's work for Israel might put the asset manager at risk of violating international humanitarian law and human rights.
